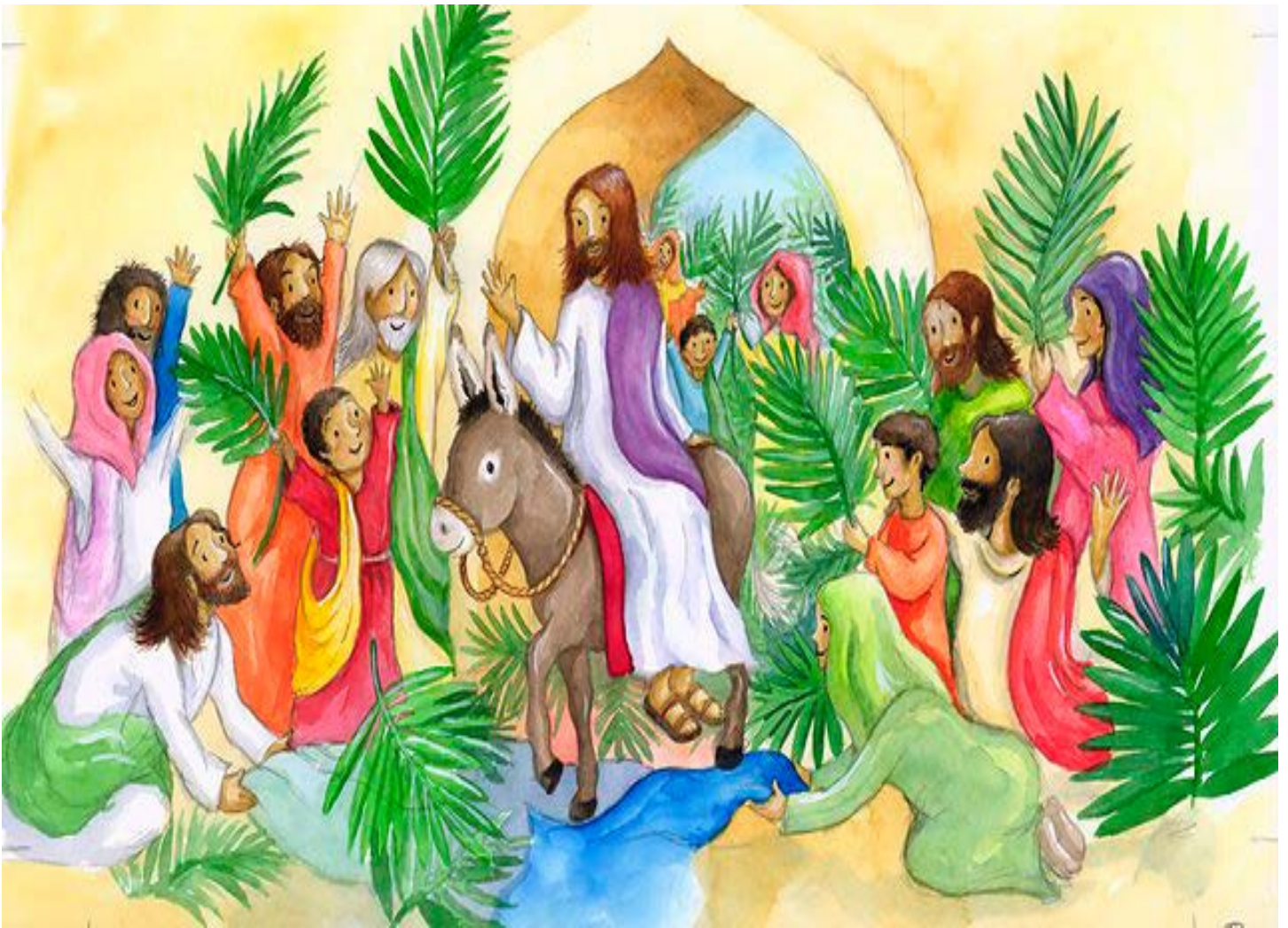

Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday has a very pointed and challenging dimension which we need to take notice of. The celebration begins with the Lucan account of Jesus' procession into Jerusalem as King over the city. The disciples shout out to the city: "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" This is a very political statement. The Pharisees in the crowd understand what is being said and caution Jesus and asking him to "rebuke [his] disciples." The Pharisees realize (and rightly fear) the wrath which may be brought onto the city in promising allegiance to Christ instead of Rome. However, Jesus' response is surprising and disturbing: "I tell you, if they keep silent, the stones will cry out!"

Both the disciples and the Pharisees understand that the revolution Jesus is bringing by leading the Israelite people out of slavery into freedom. The difference is that the disciples believe in Christ's conquest and victory; whereas the Pharisees believe Christ will die and fail. However, both limit the work of Christ to the world and misunderstand the full ramifications of Christ's entry into Jerusalem.

Christ enters Jerusalem to defeat the slave master of sin and death in order to free the people for holiness and life both in the physical world and spiritual world. Both worlds are necessary for human existence. The Pharisees and disciples both were only focused on the physical world, missing the spiritual importance of eternal life. However, modern thinking makes an opposite and equal mistake; we look at religion as only a spiritual reality which has no impact in the world. Whether we do or don't embrace the total truth that all of creation from the angels in heaven above to the stones below on earth will cry out that "Jesus Christ is Lord" is the fullness of reality. Sooner or later the truth of God's reality always catches up with us.

The choices we make should be integrated and consistent with our physical and spiritual life otherwise we do harm to both. Look at yourself! Do you make good moral decisions exercising virtues in the world? Do you foster a dynamic spiritual life? Is the main concern in your life yourself or others?

Jesus' focus was our holiness and salvation so that we could enjoy the love of God. His commitment was so complete that he entered Jerusalem so as to freely embrace the cross. Christ's vision was not limited to the world. He saw clearly the entire human reality and sacrificed his life and body, taking on the responsibility which was not his, so that all creation might be free from sin and death. How do you take on this holy responsibility to live the image of God by choosing to sacrifice your own desires so that others may live free?

Domingo de Ramos

El Domingo de Ramos tiene una dimensión muy compleja y significativa de la cual debemos tomar nota. La celebración empieza con el relato de San Lucas de la procesión de Jesús entrando a Jerusalén como Rey de la ciudad. Sus discípulos claman entre la gente, "¡Bendito el rey que viene en nombre del Señor! ¡Paz en el cielo y gloria en las alturas!" Hay mucha política en estas frases. Los fariseos que están entre la gente comprenden el significado de lo que se está diciendo y le piden a Jesús, "reprende a tus discípulos," ya que los fariseos le temen a la ira que puede desencadenarse hacia la ciudad si esta se alía a Cristo en lugar de a Roma. Sin embargo, la respuesta de Jesús es sorprendente e inquietante, "Les aseguro que si ellos se callan, gritarán las piedras."

Tanto los discípulos como los fariseos se dan cuenta de la revolución que Jesús provoca al sacar a los Israelitas de la esclavitud hacia la libertad. La diferencia está en que los discípulos creen en la conquista y victoria de Cristo, mientras que los fariseos creen que Cristo va a morir y fracasar; y ambos limitan la obra de Cristo a este mundo y no comprenden las ramificaciones completas de la entrada de Cristo a Jerusalén.

Cristo entra en Jerusalén para vencer al maestro de la esclavitud del pecado y la muerte para poder liberar a la gente hacia la santidad y la vida tanto en este mundo como en el mundo espiritual. Ambos mundos son parte de la existencia humana. Pero la ideología actual también comete el mismo error – vemos a la religión como solamente una realidad espiritual que no tiene impacto alguno en el mundo físico. Aunque veamos o no la plena verdad de que la creación entera desde los ángeles en el cielo hasta las piedras en la tierra todos claman que "Jesucristo es el Señor," tarde o temprano vamos a enfrentar esta realidad divina.

Las decisiones que tomamos deben ser congruentes con nuestra vida física y espiritual, sino le haremos daño a ambas dimensiones de nuestra vida. Mírate a ti mismo... ¿tomas decisiones buenas y morales tomando en cuenta las virtudes? ¿Fomentas una vida espiritual dinámica? ¿Tu preocupación principal en la vida es tu mismo u otros?

Jesús se enfocó en nuestra santidad y salvación para que podamos disfrutar del amor de Dios. Se comprometió tan completamente que entro a Jerusalén libremente para morir en la cruz. La visión de Cristo no estaba limitada a este mundo, sino veía claramente la completa realidad de la humanidad y sacrifico su vida y cuerpo, tomando una responsabilidad que no era suya, para que toda la creación estuviera libre de pecado y muerte eterna. ¿De qué manera tomas tú esta responsabilidad santa de vivir en la imagen de Dios, sacrificando tus propios deseos para que otros puedan ser libres?

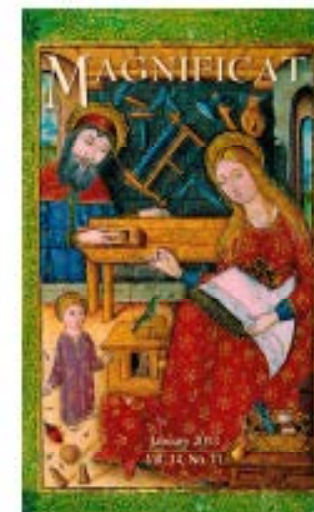

A BRIEF HISTORY OF ST. JOSEPH'S TABLE CELEBRATION

It all started in Sicily. Agriculture was important to the island and there had been no rain to nourish the crops. The dried out wheat stalks cracked beneath the feet of the poor farmers as they walked through their barren fields. Only a sea of dust and withered vines remained from what had once been row upon row of brightly colored fruits and vegetables. The only thing that thrived was the fava bean which is why it is now commonly called "the lucky bean."

The situation was critical and so the people prayed. They pleaded with St. Joseph, their patron, for relief from the terrible famine that gripped the island. Finally, the skies opened, sending down the life-giving water. The people rejoiced. Later, to show their gratitude, they prepared a table with a special assortment of foods they had harvested. After paying honor to St. Joseph, they distributed the food to the poor and needy of the Sicilian regions.

Through Sicilian immigrants, the custom was introduced to America in the early 20th century. The feast continues today and is a great source of petition and of thanksgiving to St. Joseph and our Christian call to help the less fortunate members of our community.
