Fourteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

The gospel offers a great challenge to us in this modern era . . . Simplify. Jesus calls 72 men to go before the apostles to prepare places for him in the towns and hearts of the people. The 72 appear to represent all the nations of the world and all people. All of us are called to be followers of our Lord and evangelists to our communities by preparing a place for Christ. However, as we do the Lord's work and share the gospel, we are also called to simplify. How many of us have garages or storage rooms filled with stuff which is never used? I know that my work desk occasionally gets cluttered to the point that it takes me ten minutes just to find one piece of paper. We should consider simplifying our lives in this consumer society where material things get in the way of living effectively.

Just as our lives can be cluttered with many physical objects, our spiritual life can get cluttered up with many devotions, personal expectations, and even superstition. All these things can get in the way of what is most important: our focus and faith in Christ. In the first reading, the Prophet Isaiah tells the people to rejoice with Jerusalem—their city that provides nourishment to her children and comfort in her bosom. Similarly, God provides us with nourishment and comfort through the Eucharist—the source and summit of God's sweet goodness. We are to simplify! We are to see that our participation in the Eucharist is the highest form of worship, and the source of our life here and in eternity. Simplify, and focus on the essentials of life so that we might prepare a place in our souls and in the world for Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

El Evangelio nos presenta un gran reto en esta era moderna... simplificar. Jesús llama a 72 hombres a que se adelanten a los apóstoles para preparar un lugar para El en los pueblos y en los corazones de la gente. Estos 72 aparentemente representan todas las naciones y pueblos del mundo. Todos somos llamados a seguir al Señor y ser evangelistas en nuestras comunidades, preparando un lugar para Cristo. Sin embargo, al hacer el trabajo del Señor y predicar el Evangelio, también somos llamados a simplificar. ¿Cuántos de nosotros tenemos cocheras y bodegas llenas de cosas que nunca se usan? Yo sé que mi escritorio ocasionalmente esta tan repleto de cosas que me tardo diez minutos en encontrar un solo papel. Debemos considerar simplificar nuestras vidas en esta sociedad de consumismo en la cual los bienes materiales se interponen para no dejarnos vivir de manera efectiva.

Y así como nuestras vidas pueden estar repletas de muchos objetos físicos, nuestra vida espiritual puede atiborrarse de muchas devociones, expectativas personales y hasta superstición. Todas estas cosas se pueden interponer y obstruir lo que es más importante: El enfoque y la fe en Cristo. En la primera lectura, el profeta Isaías le dice a la gente que se regocije con Jerusalén – la ciudad que alimenta a sus hijos y los consuela en su regazo. Similarmente, Dios nos alimenta y nos da consuelo a través de la Eucaristía – la fuente y cumbre de la dulce bondad de Dios. ¡Hay que simplificar! Tenemos que darnos cuenta que nuestra participación en la Eucaristía es la alabanza más alta que existe y es la fuente de nuestra vida tanto aquí como en la eternidad. Simplifica, y enfócate en las cosas esenciales de la vida para que podamos preparar un lugar en nuestras almas y en este mundo para recibir a Jesucristo, nuestro Señor y Salvador.

Independence Day

On this coming Monday July 4th, our nation celebrates Independence. The Declaration of Independence was a bold move by the colonies to stand up for liberty against the most powerful nation of that time. Today, the desperation that those men and women felt seems so far removed from the life of modern society, though the challenge has not changed. The basic premise of the Declaration of Independence is that "all men are created equal". The authors clearly point out that by virtue of God's power every human being has equal dignity regardless of status, wealth, power, race, sex, and age. This means that each person has a right to "Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness", unencumbered by those who represent the government. No public official or private citizen should gain preference or punishment if maintaining a good living. Take some time this Independence Day to read the Declaration of Independence or the Constitution of the United States and understand the importance of our nation to safeguard our right to have "Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness."

Does our nation maintain just laws so that every person can pursue these rights? Do we ensure the unborn the right to live when supporting "Pro-choice" legislation? Do we ensure the right of liberty when supporting legislation banning smoking, large soft drinks, and incandescent light bulbs; or when legislation forces individuals, companies, and institutions to pay for health services which violate moral conscience? Do we ensure the pursuit of Happiness when we fund and support cultures, societies, and nations which oppress and restrict women and religion; where a young girl is shot in the head because she dared to advocate education for women? The challenges to freedom have the same magnitude as they did on that first proclamation of Independence. In our generation, are you willing to stand for moral values of freedom and justice as our Founding Fathers did?

Este próximo lunes 4 de julio, nuestra nación celebra el día de su Independencia. La Declaración de Independencia fue un paso audaz por parte de las colonias para luchar por su libertad contra la nación más poderosa de aquellos tiempos. La desesperación que sentían esos hombres y mujeres parece muy distante de la vida que llevamos hoy en la sociedad moderna, pero el reto no ha cambiado. El principio básico de la Declaración de Independencia es que "todos los hombres son creados iguales." Los autores puntualizaron claramente que por virtud del poder de Dios, cada ser humano tiene la misma dignidad sin importar su estatus, dinero, poder, raza, genero, o edad. Esto significa que cada persona tiene el derecho a "la vida, la libertad, y la búsqueda de la felicidad", sin restricciones de aquellos que representan al gobierno. Ningún oficial público ni ciudadano privado debe ser privilegiado o castigado si lleva una vida justa. Esta Día de la Independencia, dedique un poco de tiempo a leer la Declaración de la Independencia o la Constitución de los Estados Unidos y aprecie lo importante que es que nuestro país resguarde nuestro derecho de tener "la vida, la libertad, y la búsqueda de la felicidad",

¿Mantiene nuestro país leyes justas para que todo ciudadano disfrute de estos derechos? ¿Aseguramos que los nonatos tengan derecho a la vida cuando apoyamos legislación que apoya el derecho de elegir de una mujer? ¿Aseguramos el derecho a la libertad cuando apoyamos legislación que prohíbe cosas como fumar, las bebidas gaseosas y los focos incandescentes, o legislación que obliga a individuos, empresas, e instituciones a pagar por cuidado de salud que va en contra de nuestra conciencia moral? ¿Aseguramos la búsqueda de la felicidad cuando financiamos y apoyamos a culturas, sociedades y naciones que oprimen los derechos de la mujer y la libertad de culto, en donde una señorita sufre un balazo a la cabeza por defender la educación de mujeres? Estos retos a la libertad llevan la misma magnitud que aquellos que existían durante la época de la Declaración de la Independencia. ¿Nos atrevemos los de nuestra generación a defender los valores morales de libertad y justicia tal como lo hicieron nuestros padres fundadores?
